## From the Vicar:

Dear Parishioners:

Easter. What a loaded word, because of all the expectations, questions, and doubts that come with this word which attempts to describe not only a liturgical season but a whole new reality. We have a hard time dealing with the concept of death and rightly so. It is our final and most imposing enemy because it separates us from the people who have nurtured and sustained us. It separates us from the whole dynamic called personal love. Just ask someone who has had a dear relative die; there is no time limit on grief, no time limit on how much the individual is missed, no time limit on how much we wish to see that loved one again.

God in Jesus understands our grief and the ultimate pain called death. After all, he wept at the grave of his friend, Lazarus, as he experienced his own grief and witnessed the grief of the people gathered around the tomb. Grief is an overwhelming emotion which brings home the truth that we wish to hide from: death is very real and it tries to imprison us and overwhelm us. Paul, in his First Letter to the Corinthians, boldly proclaims that Christ's resurrection is our resurrection and that the final enemy, death, was defeated by Christ's death, resurrection, and ascension. We may fear many things in our life time but death is not one of those things that we Christians have to fear. Through our baptisms we have died with Christ and have been risen with Christ. We are truly free from all spiritual enemies. We are free from our worst enemy-death.

So as you sit around the Easter table with your friends, or as you walk through the communities of Edgefield, Trenton, Johnston, and Ridge Spring, know that the wonderful people that you see and greet will always be there for you. Nothing can separate us from the love of Christ and nothing can separate us from those we love in Christ. Really celebrate this Sunday of the Resurrection.

## Liturgical Notes for April

There are many special services in April; we will be observing Holy Week and Celebrating the Resurrection of our Lord on Easter Day. I want to draw our attention to Good Friday, which in years' past, was widely observed but is less so today. Many of you, may remember, the traditional three-hour service that was observed from Noon until 3 p.m. with the rector/vicar preaching on the last words of Christ and the congregation singing hymns and saying prayers in between the series of sermons. This has faded away, especially with the addition of the Good Friday Liturgy in the 1979 Book of Common Prayer, which draws upon early Christian observances of Good Friday.

The Good Friday Liturgy (Some experts say that the word "Good" is an antiquated meaning or way of saying "Holy Friday." [Slate.com/blogs] Holy Friday or Good Friday is also called Passion Friday, Great Friday, and Sacred Friday in other cultures.

In our Liturgy, the service is divided into the following sections:

Liturgy of the Word: includes the Passion from the Gospel of John and a sermon.

The Solemn Collects: draws upon ancient prayers from the early and medieval churches.

The veneration of the Cross: allows for special devotions. This part of the service has its roots in the 4<sup>th</sup> century when pilgrims at the Church of the Holy Sepulcher in Jerusalem venerated sections of Christ's cross. [http://feastssaintsmedievalchurch.blogspot.com]

Holy Communion from the Reserved Sacrament consecrated at the Maundy Thursday service.

I hope you will be able to observe this day at 12 noon, in Edgefield, or at another congregation that offers a service at a convenient time for you.

## Food Bank Report

Thank you for continuing to support the food bank outreach ministry! In February, we raised \$695 in the collection plate and \$45 to purchase pet food. The collection plate donations are sent to the food banks quarterly to purchase food to distribute to their participants. We have continued distributing food (for both humans & pets) to Johnston, Saluda and Ridge Spring food banks. We divide the donations of food and money between the 2 large food banks on a 2-1 ratio, and distribute food to the small Ridge Spring food bank once a month. Thanks to Ric Vann and Jerrold Watson for helping transport the food to the food banks and to Tom Long Insurance for the food collection boxes at their offices. Bring your food donations (non perishable items, no glass please) to church each Sunday! The food banks can also distribute items such as toiletries (toothpaste, toothbrushes, bar soap) and don't forget spices! We also make a point of including pet food (dog & cat) to help people keep their pet animals,

### JESUS IS RISEN!

When Jesus' disciples saw that the stone was rolled away from his tomb, they knew he had risen. Make a moveable tomb to celebrate Easter.

#### What you need:

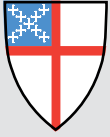
- 4 pieces of paper (brown, blue, black, yellow)
- Scissors
- Pencil
- Glue stick
- Brad fastener
- Marker



#### What you do:

1. Fold the brown paper in half, short side to short side. Cut along the fold. On one half, draw and cut out a large half-circle (the tomb). On the other, draw and cut out a palm-sized circle (the stone).
2. Glue the brown tomb onto the blue paper.
3. Cut a black circle (the inside of the tomb) the same size as the brown stone and glue it onto the brown tomb.
4. Place the brown stone over the black half-circle; this is the entrance. Push the brad through one edge so the stone can move from side to side.
5. Cut out a cross from the yellow paper and glue it by the tomb.
6. Write "Jesus is risen!" atop the blue paper.
