A word about 9-11...

As I write this, we are honoring the 23rd Anniversary of 9-11. I noticed the flags at half-mast this morning. Many are sharing memories and pictures on social media. It is one of those days that we will always remember exactly where we were and exactly what we were doing, like the Attack on Pearl Harbor, JFK's Assasination, the Challenger Disaster, and many others. It is also one of those days that we perhaps stayed glued to the television in complete and utter disbelief. If we were at work, we did not get anything done as we all listened and waited and perhaps, we might have gone home early. We might have gathered with family because we did not know what might be next. We might have picked children up from school. We might have tucked children in more carefully and spent just a few more minutes with them than we normally would. President George W. Bush was at an elementary school in Sarasota, Florida. We watched his reaction as he was told the news and tried to hold it together and act as normally and calmly as possible, not wanting to frighten a room full of children. Many closings and cancellations followed the attacks on 9-11 as well as cancellation or postponement of sporting and other events. Amusements parks shut down. The entire airspaces of the United States and Canada were closed, except military, police, and medical flights. We heard about Air Force One being the only plane flying at one point on 9-11.

It is interesting how those memories can flood back with just a few pictures, seeing videos or news coverage of that day, reading someone's post or memories. In a matter of less than two hours, we were reminded how vulnerable our country is and how fragile some of our most iconic buildings were. We were reminded that our foreign enemies can attack us on our soil. But perhaps more than anything else, we were reminded how fragile life is and how things can change in an instant. Today, it still reminds us that no one ever knows what a new day has in store. It calls us to live each day to the fullest and never miss a chance to let those closest and dearest to us know how much we love them.

On this 23rd anniversary of the terrorist attacks in our country on September 11, 2001, let us remember those who lost their lives on that day and pray for all who grieve for them and who were affected by the events of that day in any way.

A Collect for 9/11: O Almighty God, who brings good out of evil and turns even the wrath of your children towards your promised peace: Hear our prayers this day as we remember those of many nations and differing faiths whose lives were cut short by the fierce flames of anger and hatred. Hasten the time when the menace of war shall be removed. Cleanse both us and those perceived to be our enemies of all hatred and distrust. Pour out the spirit of peace on all the rulers of our world that we may be brought

through strife to the lasting peace of the kingdom of your Son; Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen. (from The Episcopal Diocese of New York)

Bells Across America

Tuesday, September 17, 2024 4:00 PM Eastern Time

All across the United States, people will be ringing bells at 4:00 PM on September 17 to celebrate the signing of the Constitution, even with Cell Phones, for Bells Across America!

During the colonial and early days of our country, bells were used to call people together, to alert them to some important announcement or event. Bells called the people of Philadelphia together to hear the Declaration of Independence read publicly for the first time on July 4, 1776. Then again, just over 11 years later, on September 17, bells were used to call people together for the first public reading of our new Constitution. This year marks the 237th anniversary of the signing of the Constitution, which is commemorated annually by the "Ringing of the Bells" across America. The Old 96 District Chapter of the NSDAR encourages all citizens, churches, schools, etc. to ring their bells for one minute in unison at 4:00 PM Eastern Time on Tuesday, September 17.

In case you are wondering, a Lay Eucharistic Minister is a lay person licensed by the bishop to administer the consecrated elements of the eucharist. Lay eucharistic ministers may be licensed to administer the consecrated bread and wine at any celebration of the eucharist in the absence of a sufficient number of priests and deacons to assist the celebrant. Prior to the current lay ministry canons, specially licensed lay readers administered the chalice at the eucharist and were known as "chalice bearers."


