Unfortunately the best way to get in touch with the Vicar is by phone or text. Internet services have yet to be restored and are presenting a challenge for communicating.

A word about Hurricane Helene ...

For the month of October, the Old Testament readings will be from the Book of Job. If you are not familiar with Job, it the story of a man who has almost everything taken away from him by Satan. And as I shared on Sunday, perhaps Job is ringing a little too close to home after Hurricane Helene coming through. Now we are certainly not in the same situation as those in Western North Carolina, but it has been tough. I know. I was without power for 8 days and I still do not have internet.

Job's wife and eventually others suggest that Job should go ahead and curse God and die. Job's answer to his wife is a question – Shall we receive the good from God and not the bad? Now, I think we can all agree that we are not in the group of people who believe God is going to punish us with a storm or other natural disaster. In fact, we have already done that and there is a story in the Bible about a guy, a really big boat, and a lot of rain.

But the past couple of weeks have not been fun. It has been downright challenging, un-nerving, stressful, and everything else. We have seen images of the flooding in Western North Carolina, whole small mountain towns gone, lots of trees

down, landscapes changed forever, trees on houses, and the list could go on.

We have experienced loss of power, no hot water, loss of all the food in the refrigerator and freezer, concern about loved ones, concern about animals, concern about fellow parishioners. On social media we have seen complaints about the power not getting restored fast enough, the government not stepping in quick enough, lines for gas and food, gas and food being hard to find, and on and on.

But we have also seen some amazing stories of hope and neighbors and communities coming together. In Edgefield, our local restaurants came together and had to think outside the box to cook and serve the community. Christine's Farm to Fork partnered with local businesses to do some things for the first responders. Power companies sent crews from all over the country who are now in turn headed to Florida. In our Diocese, churches are stepping up to help other churches and their parishioners with debris removal. Our Diocese is already laying the groundwork to form teams to go to Western North Carolina when it is safe, and we get the green light. Churches in our Diocese are partnering together to gather materials and send them to Western North Carolina. Local organizations pulling together to provide water, MREs (meals ready to eat), supplies, and meals. Local schools stepped up to house and feed all from the power companies.

In our church, we have seen stories of hope as well – those who have opened their homes for people to do laundry, take a shower, and charge devices. Those who have opened homes for people without power to stay with them. Big Ace Hardware opening even though they did not have power, getting needed supplies in, and keeping everyone updates via social media. Jack and Sarah cooking for the town of Ridge Spring. And of course, there are many more.

Granted there has been much devastation, loss of life and property, but I hope we chose to focus on what is good and what is hopeful around us. Or at least balance the hard stuff with the good stuff.

However, it is not enough to just focus on the good and the hope. As we get our own little corners of the world back to normal, it is time to turn our attention elsewhere and be the hands and feet of Christ to someone.

So, what are we called to do? Well, that is going to depend on our gifts. For some it is wielding a chainsaw or axe. For some it might be signing up for a mission team to go into Western North Carolina or perhaps helping in the same way in our diocese or our community. For others it might be helping people get their house back in order after a week or so of no power. For others it might be cooking or handing out food or even gathering food to take to Western North Carolina.

I challenge us to think in the coming days and the next few weeks about what we are called to do and how we are called to serve in the aftermath of Helene. We all know it is going to take an incredible amount of time to rebuild, so we will continue to do stuff. And we have Hurricane Milton headed to Florida and there will be lots to do there as well.

I will let you all know about opportunities, but there will be so many others, so be on the lookout. And it starts right here with our own people and the people in our surrounding communities.


