






All Saints' Day is right around the corner!

A word about Clergy Conference and being in Western North Carolina...

This week, I was at Lake Logan in Canton, NC. Lake Logan is the Diocese of Western North Carolina's Camp and Conference Center. It was absolutely beautiful, the leaves were starting to turn colors, the weather was chilly in the morning. Lake Logan sort of reminds me of Kanuga, but there is not a lodge with hotel type rooms, there are only cabins, most of which are near the lake. It is spread out over a gorgeous piece of property.

There were also clear signs that Hurricane Helene had been through there. Once getting on I-40 from I-26, there were signs every so often to remind everyone that I-40 West was closed at Exit 20 until at least 2025. After getting of the interstate along the windy roads to Lake Logan, there were piles of debris on the sides of the roads and not just trees and limbs and other yard debris like we have seen in our area. There are piles of debris from houses. There are also cars and trailers that were clearly swept by the water to a different place. There were bridges that had been swept away. As I looked at my GPS on the screen in my car, I could see the roads that were marked as closed. At Lake Logan, an area that was once all grass for large group games was nothing but dirt and sand. The tennis courts were no longer. In the lake, there were clear piles of debris and rocks on the sides and even in the middle of the lake.

After Hurricane Helene, Bishop Richards decided to cancel our time at Lake Logan and was working on other plans for some time for us to be together, even if it was just for the day. Bishop José A. McLoughlin, the Bishop of The Diocese of Western North Carolina, asked Bishop Richards to reconsider to bring much needed support and presence to Lake Logan and the Diocese of Western North Carolina. So, Bishop Richards agreed for us to still have Clergy and Spouse Retreat

at Lake Logan. Our time together was much more laid back than usual. We spent lots of time just being together and worshipping together. We did spend some time in Bible Study with our Bishop as well as taking some time to check in and support one another. We always have a Clergy Business Session the last day in which Bishop Richards, Canon Rhoades, and Archdeacon Wilson update us on things going on within the Diocese and at Diocesan House. We also heard from the clergy who are leading our Hurricane Helene Disaster Response. On Tuesday evening, Bishop José joined us for dinner and thanked us for coming, for our prayers and support, for our gathering of supplies, and for our readiness to come and help when we get the green light.

It was a good time for me to be away and with my clergy colleagues and with our Bishop for an extended period of time. It was also a very visual reminder of how much our sister Diocese in Western North Carolina needs our support and prayers.

# \* A Heartfelt Acknowledgment & Call to Action \*



We are incredibly blessed to have three sacred historical churches that we are privileged to worship in. Let us give thanks to those who had the vision to establish these churches and to all who have maintained their historical integrity.

Our Saviour's Beginnings Our Saviour owes its beginnings to the dedication and love of two remarkable women—Miss Lizzie Day and Miss Sue Hatcher. They organized in 1878, and thanks to their efforts. Our Saviour was consecrated on June 30, 1882, by Bishop William B. W. Howe, on land donated by Mrs. S. T. Hughes. Fun fact: the town of Trenton was known as Pine House before the railroad was built in 1877.

Maintaining Our Churches Keeping our three churches operational and maintained requires funding. This is why pledges are vital for budgeting necessary repairs, preventative maintenance, and improvements.

Recent Improvements at Our Saviour

Constructed a much-needed Parish Hall in February 2021 (approx. \$150,000). Refinished heart pine flooring added new carpet and pew cushions and repaired the Day-stained glass window.

Installed new HVAC units and placed stucco on the foundation to keep critters out.

# **Upcoming Projects**

Rework the handicap ramp from the Sunday school (high priority). Wish List: Connecting walkway from the Church to the Parish Hall, cosmetic

improvements to the Sunday school wing, and utilizing the second story above the Parish Hall.

Though our roof and painting are in good condition for now, they are expensive projects that will eventually need attention.

After we had an unexpected visitor on September 22 at Trinity, the Mission Council made some initial decisions regarding the safety of our children and really all of us.

We will continue to have ongoing conversations about safety and plan on having written procedures for each of our historic buildings for when we have such occurrences as this, but also for other things.

The initial decisions we would like you all to know about are:

- At Trinity we will share an officer with Edgefield First Baptist Church. We had one this past Sunday and it worked very well. He parked in the parking lot next to Trinity and was a visible presence as people were arriving for the service
- At Our Saviour we will also have an officer
- We are still working on having law enforcement presence at Grace
- At all three churches Miss Nikki will lock the doors once the children are back with her and they will remain locked until the children come back into the service.

I invite you all to participate in this exciting moment in our Church history. I PROMISE it will be a fun celebratory time!




