🕯 Vigil for National Life 🖕

Join us on the eve of the election, Monday, November 4 at 6pm at Saint Thaddeus Episcopal Church, 125 Pendleton St. SW, Aiken 29803, for a Vigil for National Life. This service of Evening Prayer and Eucharist is hosted by the Gravatt Convocation of the Episcopal Diocese of Upper South Carolina.

We will welcome our Bishop, The Right Reverend Daniel P. Richards as our preacher, and The Reverend Lathrop Mosley as our celebrant. During this service, we will pray for those running for public office, our nation, and democracy. We will also renew our baptismal vows in preparation to receive the Holy Eucharist.

All are welcome and encouraged to attend!



A word about All Saints Day....

All Saints' Day is one of a set of three holy days – All Hallows' Eve (October 31), All Saints' Day (November 1), and All Souls Day (November 2) which we acknowledge in The Episcopal Church. The three days is also known as Hallowtide and the Triduum of Death.

All Hallows' Eve or as we know it Halloween has its roots in the pagan Celtic celebration of Samhain, the beginning of winter and the first day of the new year. It was the time of the ingathering of the harvest. The approach of winter provided a reminder of human mortality. It was a time when the souls of the dead were said to return to their homes. Bonfires were set on hilltops to frighten away evil spirits. Samhain was a popular festival at the time when the British Isles were converted to Christianity. The church adopted this time for Christian use by observing All Saints' Day on November 1 and All Hallows' Eve on the evening of October 31. The Episcopal Church provides both for a Vigil on the Eve of All Saints' Day and a service for All Hallows' Eve.

All Saints' Day commemorates all saints, known and unknown. It is one of the seven principal feasts of the church year and one of four days recommended for the administration of baptism. It also may be celebrated on the Sunday following All Saints' Day, which is what many churches do.

All Souls' Day (or Commemoration of All Faithful Departed) is an optional observance. It is an extension of All Saints' Day. While All Saints' is to remember all the saints, popular piety felt the need to distinguish outstanding saints and those who are unknown in the wider fellowship of the church, especially family members and friends. Many churches commemorate all the faithful departed in the context of the All Saints' Day Celebration.


